Living with Children Evaluations: Forensic Considerations and Practice

This presentation will provide a comprehensive analysis of the factors to consider when conducting what is commonly referred to as living with children evaluations. We will review the following: the current legal standard for allowing individuals who commit sexual offenses (ICSO) to reside with a minor child, how to apply the legal standard in the evaluation process, the main factors to consider when conducting a living with children evaluation (e.g., risk aggravating factors), performing the evaluation, writing the report, and the limitations to the forensic opinions that can be provided.

- 1) Describe the legal standard for living with children evaluations and its challenges for forensic evaluators.
- 2) Apply the legal standard to the living with children evaluation considering those challenges.
- 3) Identify four main factors to consider when conducting a living with children evaluation.

- 5) Explain the limitations to the forensic opinions that can be provided.
